



Action Taken Report on Curriculum Feedback for Shree L. R. Tiwari College of Law

Background

The feedback analysis for the academic year 2020-21 revealed significant insights regarding the curriculum from both students and faculty, along with positive evaluations from employers regarding its relevance and effectiveness. This report aims to summarize the feedback and outline actionable steps for improvement based on the findings.

Feedback Summary

1. Student Feedback:

- **Practical Needs:** 55.5% of students agree that the curriculum aligns with the practical needs of the legal profession, indicating a need for enhancements.
- **Innovative Thinking:** Only 45.3% of students feel that the curriculum fosters innovative thinking, highlighting a significant gap that needs addressing.
- **Current Amendments:** A strong 73.3% believe that current amendments are included, showcasing a strength in this area.
- **Course Outcomes:** 53.1% agree that course outcomes are well-defined, but the remaining 46.9% indicate a need for better clarity.
- **Syllabus Review:** 65.9% feel the syllabus is regularly updated, yet 34.1% remain unsure, indicating room for improvement in transparency.

2. Faculty Feedback:

- **Curriculum Objectives:** All faculty members unanimously agree that the curriculum meets its objectives.
- **Emphasis on Fundamentals:** 43% of faculty agree, while 57% remain neutral, suggesting a need to reinforce fundamental concepts.
- **Modern Topics:** 64% agree that modern topics are covered, but a notable 36% are neutral.
- **Industry Requirements:** 71% believe the curriculum meets current industry requirements, yet 29% remain neutral.
- **Innovative Thinking:** 71% agree that innovative thinking is encouraged, but the remaining neutral and disagreement responses indicate a need for improvement.





3. Employer Feedback:

- **Overall Consensus:** Employers rated all aspects of the curriculum with a perfect score of 5 out of 5, indicating a strong alignment with employability, innovative thinking, litigation practice, academic flexibility, and leadership development.

Actionable Steps

Based on the feedback analysis, the following actions will be undertaken to address identified gaps and enhance the curriculum:

1. Enhance Practical Relevance:

- **Action:** Review and update the curriculum to incorporate more practical experiences, such as internships and real-life case studies, to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application.
- **Responsibility:** Curriculum Development Committee
- **Timeline:** By the end of the next academic semester

2. Foster Innovative Thinking:

- **Action:** Introduce workshops, guest lectures, and projects aimed at encouraging creative problem-solving and innovative approaches within the curriculum.
- **Responsibility:** Faculty Coordinators and Innovation Committee
- **Timeline:** Ongoing, with the first workshop planned for the next semester

3. Clarify Course Outcomes:

- **Action:** Revise course syllabi to include clear, measurable learning outcomes that are communicated effectively to students.
- **Responsibility:** Faculty Members
- **Timeline:** By the start of the next academic year

4. Increase Transparency in Syllabus Review:

- **Action:** Develop a clear communication strategy to inform students and faculty about the syllabus review process and updates, possibly through newsletters or meetings.
- **Responsibility:** Administration Office
- **Timeline:** Implement by the beginning of the next academic semester





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5. Strengthen Fundamental Emphasis:

- **Action:** Reinforce fundamental concepts through introductory courses and ensure that advanced topics are built upon a solid foundation.
- **Responsibility:** Faculty Members
- **Timeline:** Review in the upcoming academic planning session

6. Integrate More Contemporary Topics:

- **Action:** Include current trends and advancements in the legal field within the curriculum to keep pace with industry changes.
- **Responsibility:** Curriculum Development Committee
- **Timeline:** By the end of the current academic year

7. Continuous Feedback Mechanism:

- **Action:** Establish a regular feedback mechanism involving students, faculty, and employers to continuously assess and refine the curriculum.
- **Responsibility:** Quality Assurance Committee
- **Timeline:** Ongoing, with a formal review every semester
