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
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Feedback Analysis Report (AY 2020-21) Shree L.R. Tiwari College of Law

After the completion of the academic year 2020-21, feedback was collected from students, faculty members, and employers (internship providers) to evaluate the curriculum's effectiveness and relevance. The feedback was collected offline from all stakeholders, and responses were analyzed for key aspects such as curriculum design, industry relevance, and innovation development. The total responses received were as follows: 300 from students, 16 from faculty members, and 5 from employers.

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Students' Feedback on the Curriculum

The feedback from 300 students was evaluated based on five key aspects of the curriculum. The results are as follows:

1. Curriculum is based on the practical needs of the legal profession:
 - o 11% of students strongly disagreed, 12% disagreed, 18% were not sure, 31% agreed, and 28% strongly agreed.
 - o This shows that 59% of students found the curriculum aligned with practical legal needs, while 23% disagreed, indicating room for improvement.
2. Curriculum is effective in developing innovative thinking:
 - o 13% strongly disagreed, 12% disagreed, 17% were not sure, 28% agreed, and 30% strongly agreed.
 - o With 58% in agreement and 25% either disagreeing or uncertain, more emphasis could be placed on innovation.
3. Curriculum includes current amendments for effective learning:
 - o 10% strongly disagreed, 15% disagreed, 13% were not sure, 29% agreed, and 33% strongly agreed.
 - o A positive response was noted from 62% of students, though 25% felt that more updated content could be included.
4. Course outcomes are well defined:
 - o 5% strongly disagreed, 12% disagreed, 28% were not sure, 25% agreed, and 29% strongly agreed.
 - o A total of 54% of students agreed with the clarity of course outcomes, while 40% showed uncertainty or disagreement.
5. The syllabus is regularly reviewed to include the latest developments:
 - o 17% strongly disagreed, 10% disagreed, 12% were not sure, 29% agreed, and 32% strongly agreed.
 - o With 61% in agreement, the majority found the curriculum regularly updated, though 22% felt it needed more consistent revisions.





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Faculty Feedback on the Curriculum

The feedback from 16 faculty members was analyzed based on five key parameters:

1. The curriculum meets its objectives:
 - o 75% of faculty agreed (rated 3-4 out of 4), while 25% rated it lower, indicating overall satisfaction with curriculum goals.
2. The curriculum emphasizes fundamentals:
 - o 81% of faculty rated it positively (3-4 out of 4), while 19% rated it lower, showing strong support for fundamental coverage.
3. The curriculum covers modern/advanced topics:
 - o 94% of faculty agreed (rated 3-4 out of 4), suggesting broad approval of the curriculum's coverage of advanced topics.
4. The curriculum meets current industry requirements:
 - o 100% of faculty rated this positively (3-4 out of 4), indicating that the curriculum is aligned with the legal industry's needs.
5. The curriculum develops innovative thinking:
 - o 56% of faculty rated this lower (1-2 out of 4), with the remaining 44% rating it positively, suggesting that innovation development could be enhanced.



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Analysis of Alumni Feedback:

1. Practical Needs of Legal Profession:
 - o 33% of alumni strongly agreed, and 34% agreed that the curriculum aligns with the practical needs of the legal profession.
 - o 32% were either unsure or disagreed, indicating that while the majority found the curriculum relevant, there is room to enhance its practicality.
2. Innovation Development:
 - o 35% of alumni agreed, and 30% strongly agreed that the curriculum fosters innovative thinking.
 - o However, 22% either disagreed or strongly disagreed, suggesting some gaps in innovation development.
3. Current Amendments:
 - o 42% of alumni strongly agreed that the curriculum includes relevant amendments, while 33% agreed.
 - o With only 15% unsure and 9% disagreeing, this suggests that the curriculum is relatively up-to-date with current legal changes.
4. Well-Defined Course Outcomes:





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- 43% of alumni strongly agreed that course outcomes were clear, with 23% agreeing.
 - A small portion (22%) was unsure, suggesting that some alumni may not have found the outcomes fully defined during their studies.
5. Syllabus Updates:
- 38% of alumni strongly agreed, and 28% agreed that the syllabus is regularly updated.
 - Around 25% either disagreed or were unsure, indicating some concerns about the frequency of syllabus updates.





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Employer (Internship Providers) Feedback on the Curriculum

Feedback from five employers, mainly law practitioners, focused on the curriculum's relevance to employability and its effectiveness in developing skills in interns.

1. The curriculum is relevant for employability:

- 100% of the employers strongly agreed (rating 1 out of 1) that the curriculum was relevant to their practice, showcasing complete satisfaction in this area.

2. The curriculum is effective in developing innovative thinking:

- All five employers unanimously agreed (rating 1 out of 1), affirming that the curriculum encourages innovative thinking among interns.

3. The current syllabus matches litigation practice:

- Similarly, all employers gave a positive rating, indicating that the curriculum is aligned with real-world legal practice.

4. The curriculum provides academic flexibility:

- All employers were satisfied with the flexibility provided by the curriculum, which accommodates the diverse needs of legal practice.

5. The curriculum is effective for leadership development:

- The employers uniformly agreed, showing that the curriculum fosters leadership skills among students.

6. Conclusion

The feedback indicates that while the curriculum at Shree L.R. Tiwari College of Law meets the practical and academic needs of students, faculty, and employers to a large extent, there are opportunities for improvement, especially in areas such as innovation development and regular syllabus updates. Student satisfaction was generally positive, though some expressed uncertainty. Faculty members were largely supportive of the curriculum's alignment with industry standards, while employers were unanimous in their approval of the curriculum's relevance and effectiveness.
